

High School

U.S. Government: During this week, we discussed how America began to grow after earning their freedom from Great Britain. We talked about the difference between the Land Ordinance of 1785 and the Northwest Ordinance of 1787. Students also played a game in which they learned about what early colonists thought about the first government of the United States.
